**Alma de Cántaro is a tribute to some underestimated and nearly extinct varieties in the region. It is an ode to hidden beauty that prejudice overlooks.**

**Bobal: A red variety locally called “Valenciana” due to its Mediterranean origin. Sourced from sustainably farmed vineyards.**

### Tasting note

**Bobal is way more widely planted, especially in old vineyards in Ribera del Duero than people realise, but nearly always disappears into blends with other grapes. This Vino de España gives you the chance to try it on its own. Peppery, spicy and intense, with muscular tannins, damson and black olive flavours and lots of acidity. Perfect with a plate of lamb chops. Tim Atkin MW.**
